Breed: SULCATA TORTOISE

Native to: Southern edge of the Sahara, Africa; Now sold in America in pet stores

Size: 30 inches in length and weighing up to 200 pounds when full-grown.

Life Expectancy: 80-100 years!

Diet: Vegetarian, fresh grass, edible flowers, clover, cactus fruits, collard, mustard, turnip, dandelions, romaine lettuce. At Black Pine, grass hay, romaine lettuce and other leafy dark greens, and a few veggies.

Facts:

- The sulcata is the largest of the African land tortoises, and are surpassed only by the Galapagos and Aldabra tortoises in size
- Growth rings are visible, indicating age, in the tortoise's shell
- Mature males typically develop scales in the front that overlap on their legs
- Spurs round on the back legs are not known to serve any purpose
- Males have a slightly longer, thicker tail and more concave underside
- During breeding time, males are known to become quite aggressive towards one another, often ending up with bloody limbs and sometimes death
- They can grow from palm size to 45 lbs in less than 15 years
- When conditions are too hot, or too cold, they will burrow
- Sulcatas get excited just before it rains, and run around
- Tortoises hiss, croak, grunt and whistle.
- Sulcata tortoises do not hibernate
- Tortoises do not swim, they sink
- All tortoises are turtles, but not all turtles are tortoises
- Tortoises like to climb
- Some Africans regard the sulcata as a mediator between men and the gods, and they are therefore kept in villages to intercede between the head of the village and their ancestors. In Senegal, sulcatas are a sign of virtue, happiness and longevity. This respect has protected them for centuries from human dangers.

Personal History:
